VACATION POLICY

The Play Schools generously offer our families two weeks of "tuition free vacation time" annually from August to August. You must notify your director of your child's absence in advance and it must be a full week at a time (no split weeks). Vacation weeks cannot be used toward your required two-week notice if withdrawing from our school. Vacation slips are in the front entry.

The two weeks of annual vacation time started over on Monday, August 7th for all enrolled children. Therefore, all children have two weeks to use for the 2017/2018 year. Unused weeks from 2016/2017 do not roll over.

We are most grateful for any absence notifications as this may lead to some additional time off for our teachers to spend with their loved ones. If your child will be out for even a day or two, please notify the office in advance. We appreciate you taking the time to keep us in the loop regarding your child's attendance.

Kindergarten-readiness is about more than just ABCs and 123s. Kindergarten success depends as much on social-emotional readiness as it does on the cognitive skills they have gained along the way at home and at The Play School. In Kindergarten, teachers use three main instructional routines: whole class instruction (circle time); learning centers (free choice centers) and seat work (direct instruction time). Every day, our preschool 3s, 4s and 5s classroom time includes each of these. You can be sure your child has already been introduced to, and comfortable with, these instructional routines.

4 Kidz Only Club Information

We are already preparing for our annual 4 Kidz Only Summer Club for school-age children, Kindergarten and older. Every summer, our school-age Before and After Care program turns into a "camp-like environment" where your child can enjoy safe and engaging field trips off-campus three to four days each week. This is a well-structured, field trip program that is staffed full-time by three consistent, highly competent Play School teachers who respect and understand the awesome responsibility of taking your child out into our local community. This year, we are focusing our summer plans on *fresh air, movement, field trips, EXPERIENCES, new discoveries, and socialization!* The Play School is going on a "technology diet" this summer! We want the children to socialize with each other, continue to develop kindness, and build on the friendships that already exist within our school while building new connections with other children their age. We can't achieve these goals if the children are constantly immersed in technology. We know that most kids get plenty of exposure to technology at their elementary schools or homes and we simply want to have a "technology time out" at The Play School in order to offer variety in their long summer days! If you're ready for your child to have a hiatus from handheld devices, The Play School's 4 Kidz Only Summer Club is the perfect environment for your school-ager!

Our program's space is limited due to state licensing ratios and available spots on our Play School private buses. Due to its popularity and terrific reputation, this program consistently fills up in advance each and every summer. We open registration in March for the upcoming summer to our currently enrolled families. A deposit equal to one week's tuition is due, along with a registration form that we will soon send out, to hold your child(ren)'s spot. Since the deposit is held separately in your family's Play School account and will be applied toward the first week's tuition, the only thing that will be due the first week will be field trip fees and the Summer Supply Fee. Once the initial registration period (exclusive to currently enrolled Play School families) has closed, we will open any remaining spots to the public until we have reached our summer program maximum. Please don't delay as we don't want your child to miss out on all the great activities we have planned for the summer of 2018!

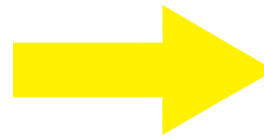
