We will be getting outside at every opportunity.




Please make sure you have done the following to ensure your child is ready for outdoor play and warmer weather:

- Check your child's cubby for both seasonal and size-appropriate clothing. Take home those heavy sweaters and fleece lined winter pants and replace with "extra" clothes that are comfortable for this upcoming weather. Make sure you leave an extra pair of socks at school for our indoor gym time.
- Supply your child's teacher with a new, unopened, LABELED bottle of sunscreen. This must be lotion. We cannot accept aerosol sprays due to licensing regulations. (One per child, please. Siblings in different classrooms cannot share.)
- Sign off on the "walking field trip permission slip." See your teachers for more specific information.

2019/2020 ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TRANSPORATION:

The Play School is proud to have an amazing Before/After School program for our school-agers. We provide transportation to school in the morning as well as picking the children up in the afternoon. Each school will have a specific transportation route for the 2019/2020 school year. If you are going to be needing care for the 2019/2020 school year, please let your director know as we will be planning our routes soon. Thank you!





VACATION POLICY

The Play Schools generously offer our families two weeks of "tuition free vacation time" annually from August to August. You must notify your director of your child's absence in advance and it must be a full week at a time (no split weeks). Vacation weeks cannot be used toward your required two-week notice if withdrawing from our school. Vacation slips are in the front entry.

The two weeks of annual vacation time started over in August for all enrolled children. Therefore, all children have two weeks to use for the 2019/2020 year. Unused weeks from 2018/2019 do not roll over.

We are most grateful for any absence notifications as this may lead to some additional time off for our teachers to spend with their loved ones. If your child will be out for even a day or two, please notify the office in advance. We appreciate you taking the time to keep us in the loop regarding your child's attendance.

Despite the Internet taking over most of our entertainment needs, the most natural place for kids to play is outside is in nature. However, sometimes the weather prevents outdoor play from happening, and your kids must find ways to enjoy themselves inside. If you can get your kids to have fun while learning something at the same time, then your family has hit the jackpot. Next time there's a rainy day, try one of these budget-friendly activities that checks all the boxes and saves you money.

The Internet has more to offer children than Youtube videos and social media. The greatest thing about the Internet is having access to many resources without having to pay a dime. If you know where to look, you can find endless opportunities for learning and education in the form of fun online activities. That means your children can be online while being productive. Here are three suggestions for free online content that provide fun activities for children:

- 1. **Exercise Videos** Since bad weather means that the kids can't reach their physical activity quota outside, try getting them involved in indoor exercise. You can find just about any type of exercise video, from yoga to dance to fun cardio. Just be sure to review the videos first or only use trusted sources.
- 2. **Brain Games** When homework is done for the day, keep the mental flow going by engaging your kids in online brain games and puzzles. The National Geographic kids' site has videos, games, and downloadable puzzles to challenge and "give your brain a workout" at no cost.

Hands-on Activities

- 2. **Science Experiments** All kids love science experiments, even if they don't enjoy science class. Oftentimes, the hands-on experiments are what help kids develop a love for science. Experimentation doesn't require an expensive shopping trip or list of fancy, hard-to-find ingredients. Everything you need for a project like elephant's toothpaste can be found in your pantry at home.
- 3. Musical Instruments Playing a musical instrument can be very beneficial for a child's learning and development, and what better time to practice than on a rainy day?
