

SIDS AWARENESS MONTH

October is National SIDS Awareness Month. In the United States, nearly 1,000 babies die each year from suffocation in their sleep. Sudden Unexpected Infant Death Syndrome (SUIDS) is the leading cause of injury deaths of children younger than one year old. But this tragedy is preventable It is as easy as A B C -- Alone, on the Back, in a Crib. This means a baby should sleep by himself, on his back, in a safe crib, bassinet, or portable playard (such as Pack 'n Play ®). At The Play School, our infant staff are all safe sleep trained along with CPR and first aid. There are several policies in place to assure the infant classrooms are a safe sleep environment for the children. Many of the policies we follow can easily be followed at home too. Children must sleep in a crib with a tight fitted sheet and no blankets, toys, or bibs. Children are always placed in the cribs on their back. In addition, children may not sleep in seats, on the floor, or swaddled. Pacifiers may not have clips on them or have any animal attached to them. The Play School is a corporate sponsor and gives annually to American SIDS Institute. If you have any questions regarding providing a safe sleep environment for your infant at home, please do not hesitate to reach out to an infant teacher or your school director.

Helpful Hints and Tips

POTTY TRAINING TIPS

This is the second installation of POTTY TRAINING: TIPS FROM THE EXPERTS.

Potty Training Tip #2: Here is another important point to consider as your child is practicing on the potty at home: potty vs. toilet. At The Play School, we have child sized porcelain toilets that flush with a typical, loud sound. At home, your child may have a separate little potty or a padded toilet seat insert. (Those are not sanitary enough for our setting, so we do not utilize those at school.) Since you have more flexibility at home, take advantage of it. Toilets are big and loud. Some children are frightened by them; others know the small potty is not what adults use and may give it a snub. So, have both a seat inserts and a small potty available. Use the one your child prefers without making a fuss or trying to talk your child into the option most convenient for you. Take a bold step and try underwear at school. Send lots of changes of underwear, pants, and socks for accidents when they happen. If your child has been potty training at school, please to check their supply of spare clothes. We play hard at school and often get messy. Spare clothes in your child's backpack are always in need.

PUMPKIN PIE BAKED OATMEAL

This Baked Pumpkin Oatmeal has all the warm flavors of pumpkin pie in a quick and easy breakfast idea.

PREP TIME 10 MINUTES
COOK TIME 25 MINUTES
TOTAL TIME 35 MINUTES

INGREDIENTS

- 1 ½ cups quick-cooking oats
- 1 cup solid pumpkin (pumpkin puree)
- 3/4 cup milk
- 3/4 cup chopped pecans, divided (use 1/4 cup for top)
- 1/4 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 1 egg
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1½ teaspoons pumpkin pie spice mix
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- milk, for serving (optional)

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 350° F and grease a 9-inch square or 2-quart baking dish.
- 2. Mix all ingredients together in a large bowl and stir until well combined. Spread into prepared dish. Sprinkle top with 1/4 cup chopped pecans and bake for 25-30 minutes, or until edges are starting to turn golden brown.
- 3. Serve with a drizzle of milk.

During this unprecedented time, We want you to know that the Health and Safety of our families and staff are of the upmost importance.

Here is an update of what our protection from Covid looks like:

- First and foremost, Hand-washing is key! Always has been and always will be.
- Our in-house laundry runs all week, every day and all infant bedding, fabric covers and soft items are washed constantly.
- We have a cleaning crew on our premises, they are vetted and part of our Staff.
- Carpet shampooing is part of our routine and not just a quarterly event.
- We have streamlined the temperature taking by installing no-contact infrared forehead thermometers.
- Indoor gym and sensory room are sanitized between classrooms.
- Hand sanitizer is utilized upon entering and exiting common play areas.
- Teachers are using their nap-times to sanitize toys midday and infant and toddler rooms are sanitizing toys constantly.
- We have the children outdoors as much as possible and within reason, weather permitting. We urge outdoor learning; story time under a tree is a dear sight to see Covid or no Covid. Children can learn as much outdoors as indoors we believe! It is a science Lab, an art gallery, lunchroom, a library, symphony hall, theater, and a gymnasium!

We are concerned and care about our teachers. They are hiding their stress and anxiety well. They know we support them and they simply do not come to School if they do not feel well. We have built in subs for this reason. Our directors know that the children come first. Covid testing is widely encouraged and we are and

will always be transparent about the health of any person in our building that affects your family personally. Covid bonuses and benefits have been given to our teachers throughout this ordeal. We will continue this process to the end. Our Teachers are essential, Covid or no Covid! ~ Ms. Rita
